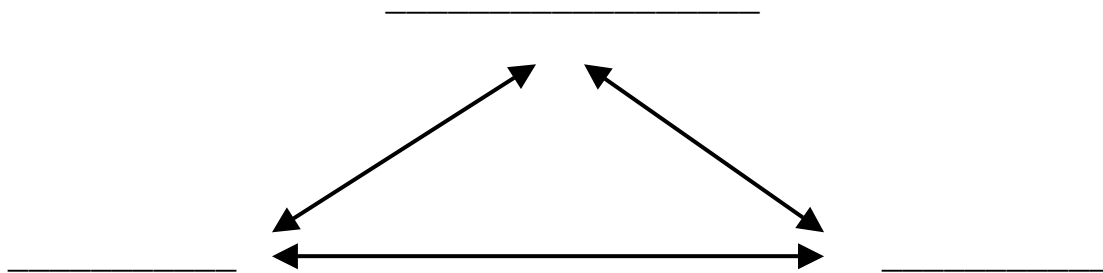

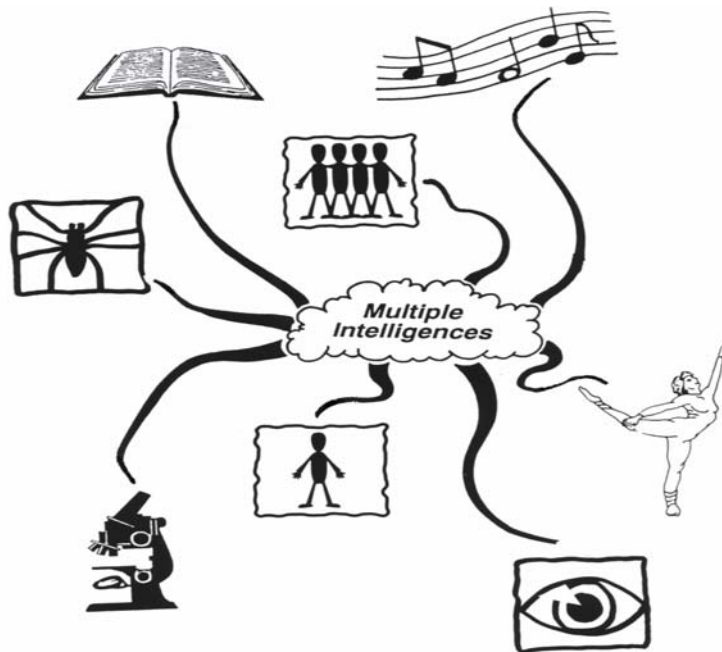

My bowl is tiny ...*

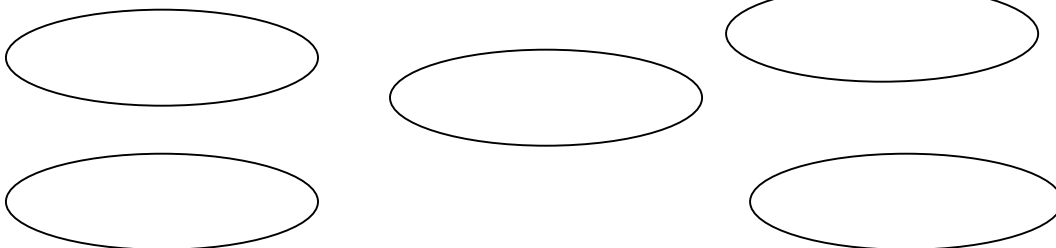
Story song:

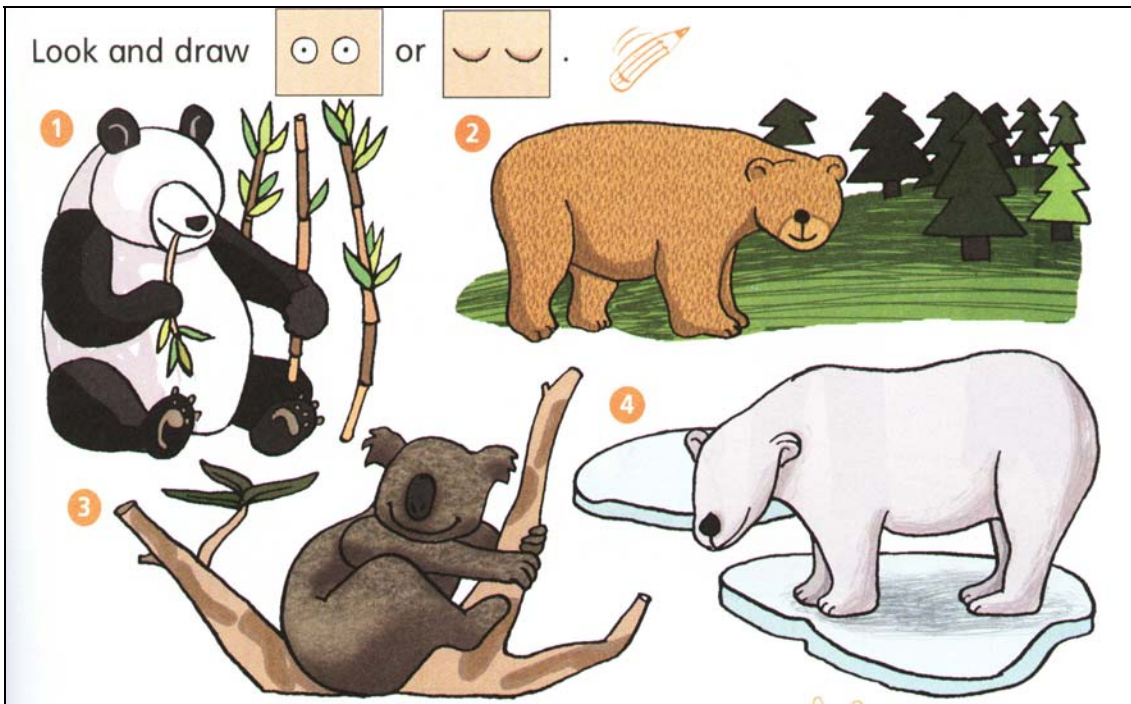






